

# Singapore in phase three

The Republic will enter the next phase of its reopening on Dec 28. Here is what to expect:



## Leisure and social activities

- People can gather in groups of eight, up from five now. Households may also receive up to eight visitors at any one time.
- Attractions can apply to increase their operating capacity from 50 per cent to 65 per cent. Measures must remain in place to prevent crowding in popular areas.
- Capacity limit for malls will be raised from 10 sq m to 8 sq m per person.



## Places of worship

- Capacity for congregational and other worship services to be raised to **250** people, in zones of up to **50** people each.
- Live performances for services held by religious organisations, as well as rites and prayers at places of worship, can resume in a limited capacity. Wind instruments like flutes are allowed.



## Performances

- Indoor live performances and pilots for outdoor live performances can have audiences of up to **250**, in zones of up to **50** people each.



## Weddings and funerals

- Up to **eight visitors** can attend marriage solemnisations held at home. Currently, only **10** people – including members of the hosting household, and excluding the solemniser and vendors – are allowed.
- Live instrumental music will be allowed for weddings and funerals, but not wind instruments like flutes or saxophones.



## Implementation of TraceTogether-only SafeEntry

- The requirement to use the TraceTogether app or token for SafeEntry check-ins will kick in early next year, after everyone who wants a token has had a chance to collect one.
- As at Sunday, about **65 per cent** of the resident population are on the TraceTogether programme. It is on track to hit about **70 per cent** by the end of the year.
